## Materials

1 Fat Quarter each of eight blue/green Tonga Batiks: TONGA-B6918 CHARCOAL (Fabric 1)
TONGA-B6917 PATINA (Fabric 2) TONGA-B6916 SLATE (Fabric 3) TONGA-B6914 POOL (Fabric 4) TONGA-B6913 LAUREL (Fabric 5) TONGA-B6430 MINT (Fabric 6)
TONGA-B6912 SEAFOAM (Fabric 7) TONGA-B6911 MIST (Fabric 8)
$1 \frac{1}{8}$ yard for blocks and cornerstones TONGA-B7900 PARCHMENT (Fabric 9)
23/4 yards for block sashing
TONGA-B3398 CREAM
2 yards X-Wide (106") for backing and binding XTONGA-B6289 FERN
Twin batting 72" by 90"
Basic Sewing supplies

## Cutting Instructions

From each of the eight fat quarters,
Cut twenty 4 " squares.
From the cornerstone and block fabric (Tonga-B7900 Parchment), cut: - Two 4" x WOF (width of fabric) strips. Cross-cut these strips into twenty 4" squares.

- Thirteen 2" x WOF strips.

Keep 4" squares from the same fabric together and number them 1-9 as noted in the Materials list.
rom the sashing fabric (Tonga-B3398 Cream), cut

- Twelve 4" x WOF strips for horizontal sashing.

Ten 4" x WOF strips for vertical sashing. Cross-cut these strips into 195 rectangles measuring 2 " $\times 4$ ".

## Instructions

Horizontal Sashing Strips
. Alternating the twelve $4^{\prime \prime}$ Cream sashing strips and twelve of the thirteen 2" Parchment strips, create three strip sets of eight pieces each. (figure 1) Each strip set should begin with a 2" strip and end with a 4 " strip. Stitch the remaining $2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the 4 end of one strip set. Press all seams toward the $4^{\prime \prime}$ units.
2. Cross cut each of the strip sets into sixteen 2 " segments. (figure 2) Stitch one piece from each of the sets together end-to-end to form one long sashing strip of twenty-five pieces. (figure 3) Each of these horizontal sashing strips will begin and end with a 2 " square. You will need sixteen horizontal sashing strips.

Block Rows \& Quilt Top Assembly
Follow the Layout Chart.There are twelve squares and thirteen vertical sashing strips in each horizontal row. Each row should begin and end with a sashing strip.
3. Begin with the top row.Alternating 4 " squares with 2 " x 4 " sashing rectangles, stitch the squares together in a row. Press
the seams toward the sashing strips.
4. Add a horizontal sashing strip to the bottom edge of the first row. Press the seam toward the block units.
5. Continue to make rows in order and, alternating rows with horizontal sashing strips, sew them together as you complete them. This will make it easy to keep the pattern organized. 6.Add horizontal sashing strips to the top and bottom edges. Press.
Finishing
7. From the $72^{\prime \prime}$ length of the backing fabric, cut four $2^{\frac{1}{4}}{ }^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ $72^{\prime \prime}$ binding strips. Stitch these strips together end-to-end on $45^{\circ}$ angle to form one long strip. Press the seams open. Fold the binding in half, right side out and press.
8. Layer the completed quilt top with batting and the remaining backing fabric. Quilt as desired.
9. Trim the edges of the batting and backing even with the quilt top. Stitch the prepared binding to the edge of the quilt, mitering the corners. Fold the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and stitch in place by hand.
